
Foreign, Commonwealth & Development Office Advice

Whitby

Saturday 3rd July 2021

A popular seaside town in Yorkshire, split by the River Esk and the hometown of the explorer, Captain James Cook. The town is lined with several quirky shops, cafes with strange names and pubs. On the East Cliff, the ruined Gothic Whitby Abbey was Bram Stoker's inspiration for "Dracula" and nearby is the Church of St. Mary. Both can be reached by 199 steps from the centre of Whitby. The Captain Cook Memorial Museum, in the house where Cook once lived, displays paintings and maps. West of the town is West Cliff Beach, lined with beach huts. Whitby claims to have the best fish and chips in the country all supplied with fresh fish every day from this thriving port.

Delights of Whitby – Half Day

Enjoy an overview of Whitby with a panoramic drive to the East Headland and a walking tour of the historic town.

Whitby Walking Tour – Half Day

Take a guided walking tour to explore this charming place filled with myth, legend and seafaring mystery.



Newcastle

Sunday 4th July 2021

A vibrant and diverse city which was a major shipbuilding and manufacturing hub during the industrial revolution and now a centre of business, arts, and sciences. This charming city is bursting with a thriving nightlife, award-winning restaurants and great museums. It is also the starting point for excursions to Hadrian's Wall, a UNESCO World Heritage site.

Hadrian's Wall - Step into England's Story – Half Day

Designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1987 explore the fascinating site of Hadrian's Wall, one of the most important monuments built by the Romans in Britain.

Newcastle continued...

Introduction to Newcastle & the Angel of the North – Half Day

Capture the city of Newcastle's mix of contemporary and historic highlights, from stunning modern architecture to the iconic sculpture designed by Antony Gormley.

Whey Ale Man – Regional Beer Experience – Half Day

A former medieval friary with a unique tasting room. Sit in the original Tanners Guild meeting place and sample some of the region's best beers whilst learning a little about their creation.

Berwick-upon-Tweed

Monday 5th July 2021

Berwick-upon-Tweed is the northernmost town in England. It is located at the mouth of the River Tweed on the east coast and 2½ miles south of the Scottish border. Cobbles, castles, beaches, and boat trips await you in historical Berwick-upon-Tweed. Secrets of a bloody, conflict-filled history linger in its Elizabethan town walls and ruinous castle remains.

Lindisfarne (Holy Island) – Half Day

Cross the dramatic causeway to Holy Island, only accessible at low tide. Renowned for its medieval religious heritage.

River Tweed Boat Cruise – Half Day

Explore the River Tweed aboard the Border Rose, keep an eye out for seals, dolphins and more wildlife that inhabit the tidal mud flats.

Berwick-upon-Tweed Walking Tour – Half Day

Walking the walls of Berwick, learn about military conflicts that have taken place here and discover how the garrison town played an integral part in English and Scottish history.





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
