
Foreign, Commonwealth & Development Office Advice

Douglas

Monday 26th July 2021

The Capital of the Isle of Man where horse drawn trams ply the promenade on Douglas Bay. The Isle of Man is an internally self-governing dependency of the British Crown and is known for its natural beauty, rolling hills and quirky attractions.

Please note coaches on IOM are limited and island buses may be used as an alternative. The best available transport will be provided but, vehicles may not be as modern as those provided in cities and more established cruise ports.

Lady Isabella & Snaefell Mountain – Half Day

Travel along the eastern coast to Laxey a former mining village, climb atop of the largest working waterwheel for superb views of the Valley, then on to Snaefell Mountain Railway to board a vintage carriage on the only electric mountain railway in the British Isles.

Coastal Walk on the Isle of Man - Volcanoes and Vikings Half Day

One of the most beautiful walks on the island for stunning coastal scenery, birdlife and archaeological remains.

Holyhead

Tuesday 27th July 2021

The port of Holyhead is the busiest UK Irish ferry port and is a regular port of call for the largest seagoing ferry in the World. Take in the views over the port from the grounds of St Cybi's church and skinnners monument on Alltran rock. There are excellent walks to discover, from coastal walks at the Breakwater Country Park to the extensive network of trails in the magnificent Snowdonia National Park.

Snowdonia Highlights – Half Day

Venture into the mountainous heart of Snowdonia National Park and capture stunning scenery.



Caernarfon Castle – Half Day

A scenic journey across Anglesey and the Menai Straits to Caernarfon, explore the magnificent ruins and afterwards enjoy free time at leisure to explore further.

Quirky Portmeirion – Half Day

Set on a private peninsula with sandy beaches, enjoy sub-tropical woodlands, gardens and stunning features. Portmeirion is considered one of the most unconventional architectural projects of the 20th century.

Fishguard

Wednesday 28th July 2021

Below the Preseli Hills on Pembrokeshire's scenic coast you'll find this charming fishing village. Steeped in history and home to quaint shops, cafes and restaurants. The nearby Gwaun Valley flows between Fishguard and the Preseli Mountains, where there is plenty of wildlife and prehistoric sites to explore.

Fishguard Coastal Walk – Half Day

Take a walk with an experienced guide for a walk along the beautiful Pembrokeshire coastal path, joining the circular walk to Aberbach, a small, secluded pebble beach surrounded by low cliffs with tiny coves and caverns.

Picton Castle – Half Day

Set in 40 acres of magnificent gardens, Picton Castle is perhaps the most unusual ancient building in Britain with half the building designed as a fortified manor and the other half a fully developed medieval castle.

St David's Head & Carn Llidi Hike – Half Day

Walk from the sandy sweep of Whitesands Bay uphill to the windswept peninsula with superb views across the Bay. Then continue to a wild stretch of coast towards Carn Llidi.





Ilfracombe

Thursday 29th July 2021

Ilfracombe is a seaside resort and civil parish on the North Devon coast, with a small harbour surrounded by cliffs. It has been a port here since at least the 12th Century and a settlement for much longer. Today the predominant use is for leisure and tourism but this is still a working harbour with fish and seafood landed daily. Along the Quay and in the surrounding streets there are restaurants, cafes, tea gardens and pubs. Small shops abound selling gifts and other quirky goods, art galleries.

Dunster Castle and Village – Full Day

A former motte and bailey castle and now a country house, there will be an opportunity to wander around the gardens and enjoy a picnic lunch before visiting the village of Dunster for some free time to explore.

Castle Hills Woodlands Gardens – Half Day

Set in a spectacular 18th century landscape with grass terraces and statues leading down to the river and lakes. Take a tour of the gardens leading down to the river before reaching the castle and then heading back to the West Wing of the house for a Devonshire cream tea.

Chambercombe Manor and Combe Martin – Half Day

Enjoy a tour of the house with one of the Manor's guides, take time to walk around the gardens at your own pace before continuing on to Combe Martin, a hidden gem in the heart of North Devon's beautiful coastline.

St Mary's

Friday 30th July 2021

The Isles of Scilly's largest island and the gateway to the rest of the islands. Covering an area of little more than 6 square miles. Hugh Town is the central hub, with a cluster of shops, banks and eateries, whilst Old Town is the other "major" settlement, with a

beautiful beach and nature reserve. The coastline features large stretches of deserted sandy beaches, dramatic rocky coves, beautiful walks and stunning seascapes.

Wildlife Cruise & St Martins Vineyard – Half Day

Journey around the raw and rugged eastern isles which is a haven for wildlife, then take a stroll through St Martin's Vineyard and savour the tastes of the local wines.

Exotic Tresco Abbey Gardens – Half Day

This incredible sub-tropical 'botanical paradise' has been planted in the ruins of a Benedictine priory under the direction of Augustus Smith. Today the gardens are home to an impressive collection of 20,000 plant species heralding from as far as New Zealand, South America and South Africa.

Dartmouth

Saturday 31st July 2021

Dartmouth sits on the banks of the picturesque River Dart with a rich maritime heritage. It is part of the stunning South Devon Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty which is wonderful for those wanting to explore the beautiful countryside.

Countryside Steam Train & The English Riviera – Half Day


Discover Devonshire with a walking tour of Dartmouth, cruising along the River Dart to Totnes and riding a traditional steam train through the rolling scenery of Kingswear.

Slapton Ley Nature Walk – Half Day

Enjoy a guided walk of one of the finest areas of the British coastline, Slapton Ley the largest natural lake in south-west England.

Buckfast Abbey & Medieval Totnes – Half Day

Visit the fascinating Buckfast Abbey and stroll through the charming market town of Totnes.





Lyme Regis

Sunday 1st August 2021

Sometimes dubbed the “Pearl of Dorset”, it lies on Lyme Bay at the Dorset–Devon border. Atmospheric coastal town with pretty georgian streets, ancient harbour. Home to famous georgian fossil collector, Mary Anning. No trip to Lyme Regis would be complete without fossil hunting, and the Lyme Regis Museum. The Cobb Harbour, full of history, romance and scenery.

Abbotsbury Sub-Tropical Gardens and Swannery – Half Day

Visit the beautiful Sub-tropical gardens where you will have time to wander and relax over some light refreshments at the Old Colonial Tea House, then on to the Swannery, the only place in the world where you are able to walk through the heart of the colony of nesting Mute Swans.

Lyme Regis Walk – Half Day

Explore the heart of the UNESCO Jurassic Coast where the beaches between Lyme Regis and neighboring towns are world famous for fossil hunting.



Poole

Monday 2nd August 2021

The Old Town has Georgian houses and Poole Museum, which explores local history. From Poole Harbour, boats head south to Brownsea Island. This wooded area has trails and wildlife such as red squirrels, plus 16th-century Brownsea Castle, now a private hotel. The harbour is a drowned valley formed at the end of the last ice age and is the estuary of several rivers.

Mystical Stonehenge – Half Day

Enjoy an awe-inspiring visit to the enigmatic Stonehenge – a World Heritage Site and the world’s most famous stone circle which remains a mystery.

RSPB Nature Walk – Half Day

Join your RSPB Arne guide for a guided walk, keeping your eyes peeled for wildlife and enjoying the beautiful landscape.





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
